#### DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISES

y Executive Order in 2001, General Order 156 was amended to include Service Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises as one of three diverse

target market groups that include women-owned and minority-owned businesses. The certification process for DVBEs, as they are commonly known, is administered by the **California Department of General Services (DGS)**. The DGS forwards DVBE certification information directly to the **California Public Utilities Commission's Clearinghouse**, and this information is then included with all certified diverse suppliers on the Clearinghouse web site.

The DVBE spend goal for investorowned utilities (such as PG&E) is **1.5 percent** of our total spend. From January 2006 through August of this year, PG&E's spend with DVBE vendors has exceeded **\$55 million**. One notable success has been the partnership of our strategically sourced staffing supplier, CORESTAFF Services and DVBF subcontractor Amerit Consulting (See Supplier Profile). Through August of this year, as a Tier Two supplier, Amerit Consulting has already eclipsed the **\$5 million** mark in providing services to PG&E.

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# Going Green with Supplier Diversity

n support of our diverse business community, PG&E's Supplier Diversity team is taking an active role in promoting the value of energy efficiency directly with suppliers as well as during our participation in external events.

At this year's **California Hispanic Chamber of Commerce (CHCC) Annual Convention and Expo**, held in **August** in **San Francisco**, PG&E participated in a business session to discuss the benefits for suppliers of adhering to a green philosophy. PG&E supplier **S&S Tools** was invited to participate in a business

panel. **S&S Tools CEO Tracy Tomkovicz** gave real-life examples from being part of **PG&E's Green Supply Chain Program**. The overall theme of S&S Tool's presentation was that going green is easy because it is about small steps making a big difference when it comes to the environment. Tokovich gave an overview of the innovative green ideas her company has implemented, including savings realized by reducing energy use in its facilities through small steps such as changing out light fixtures in warehouses.

The CHCC event was the second in which Supplier Diversity and the Green Supply Chain Program team have partnered to promote our green initiative. On **July 31**, Supplier Diversity hosted the First Small Business Green Training in conjunction with the **San Francisco Small Business Development Center**. The program was facilitated by Supplier Diversity's **Tita Gray**, and the training was conducted by sustainability expert **Miriam Karell** from **Three Point Vision**. Five of PG&E's diverse suppliers were invited to attend a half-day training on

green sustainability in an effort to integrate these practices in how they do business with PG&E. The training was designed to prepare them to adopt more environmentally friendly and sustainable practices into its business model. The training also provided access to green certification, mentoring, cost-saving ideas and counseling to assist each company. Each supplier was given a USB that included information on all PG&E rebate programs, as well as city and state resources on sustainable practices.

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Despite the significance of these accomplishment, PG&E has yet to meet the annual target spend of 1.5 percent. According to **Charles Twamugabo**, **Supply Chain Senior Director**, "The DVBE target has been a challenging one for PG&E, as well as other utilities, to annually meet. As written, General Order 156 states DVBE suppliers must be domiciled within the state of California, and this results in limiting the ability to capture diverse spending with qualified, out-of-state DVBEs. This is the only diverse market segment that adheres to this type of logistical policy restriction. To continue to seek opportunities to increase our spending with the DVBE market, we have expanded our partnerships within this business community and through these efforts have identified multiple suppliers to consider as potential candidates for supplier development."

Represented by Senior Supplier Diversity Consultant Skip Solorzano, this year, PG&E has sponsored and participated in several Veteran/ DVBE events, including the CA DVBE Alliance "Keeping the Promise" Conference, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers 7th Annual Veterans and Small Business Training and Outreach Conference, the 4th Annual National Veteran Small Business Conference and Expo, and the Elite Service Disabled Veteran Owned Business (SDVOB) Network's 5th Annual National Conference. In addition, Solorzano represents PG&E as a corporate advisory member of the CA DVBE Alliance and serves as a corporate member of the Elite's SDVOB Network. Solorzano states, "It has been a privilege to support the DVBE business community. When one recognizes their discipline and courage to serve our country, how can one not be an advocate of this sector?"

PG&E encourages our prime suppliers to join us in support of the DVBE business community and these outstanding business organizations.
